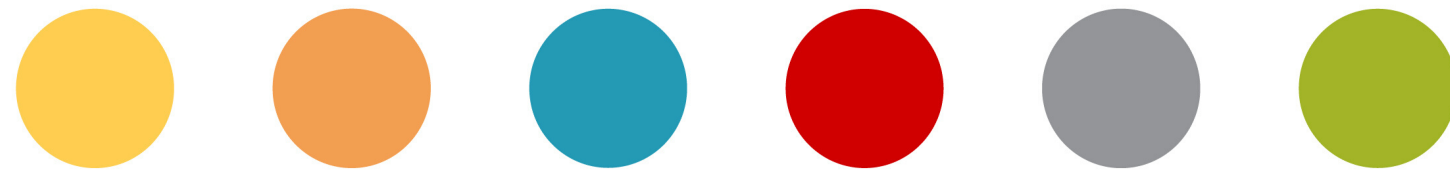

NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program

Learn about the National Science Foundation Graduate Fellowship, which is open to graduating seniors and first-year graduate students. This session will discuss the details of the application, and application process. The awards are three-year full fellowships for graduate study (\$12,000 in tuition; \$34,000 living stipend) leading to research-based masters or doctoral degrees.
