

Architectural Engineering Nonresident Scholarship
UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT OMAHA

The regulations governing the Architectural Engineering Nonresident Scholarship are as follows:

1. The Architectural Engineering Nonresident Scholarship is a scholarship package that consists of the following awards:
 - \$15,000 per year (divided equally between the fall and spring semesters) as a partial tuition waiver. This partial tuition waiver will be applied to undergraduate credit hours required to complete a first bachelor's degree in Architectural Engineering
 - \$2,500/5,000 per year (divided equally between the fall and spring semesters) – private Durham School foundation funds
2. The undergraduate Architectural Engineering Nonresident Scholarship may be renewed for an additional three years.
3. This scholarship program is for Architectural Engineering majors only. This scholarship will be forfeited if, at any time, you change your major and are no longer admitted in Architectural Engineering. You must maintain good academic standing in Architectural Engineering. Specifically, you cannot declare Architectural Engineering for scholarship purposes and take classes from another UNO college. You must progress through the Architectural Engineering curriculum and be making progress toward an architectural engineering degree.
4. For the fall and spring semesters, full-time enrollment (12 or more credit hours) of undergraduate level coursework is required. And, you must successfully complete at least 24 credit hours per year in the fall and spring semesters.
5. Renewal of this scholarship for each subsequent year is dependent upon the recipient maintaining a 3.00 minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA), reviewed at the end of the spring semester.
6. The scholarship will be terminated if you withdraw from school or fail to register for consecutive semesters (excluding summer), unless an exception is granted because of extenuating circumstances.
7. The \$15,000 partial tuition waiver portion of the scholarship package cannot be used in conjunction with tuition remission scholarships where the benefit exceeds the cost of tuition charges. This includes, but is not limited to, the Nebraska nonresident tax tuition credit, Employee and Dependent Scholarship Program, Athletic scholarships or any other university tuition remission.
8. Failure to comply with the above regulations will result in cancellation of the Architectural Engineering Nonresident Scholarship.
