

FE Exam Cost Reimbursement from Nebraska Board of Engineers and Architects (\$100)

Nebraska engineering graduates who have passed the FE Exam may qualify for a \$100 reimbursement from the Board of Engineers and Architects if they meet the following requirements:

- Graduated from an EAC/ABET-accredited engineering program in Nebraska,
- Passed the FE Exam on the first attempt, no later than nine months after graduation, and
- Have qualifying educational “debt.” Qualifying education debt is defined as any government or commercial loans obtained by a student for post-secondary education, tuition, other educational expenses (e.g. books, fees, supplies), or reasonable living expenses, as determined by the Board. Note: nearly every student has at least \$100 of such expenses or “debt.”

To request reimbursement:

- Complete the [Engineering Educational Debt Reimbursement Request Form](#) and send the completed form to the Board.
- Request a copy of your official transcript (<https://registrar.unl.edu/student/transcripts/>) to be sent directly to the Board's office from the granting institution. Electronic transcripts may be sent to nbea.office@nebraska.gov. Note: Master/Doctorate graduates from the University of Nebraska will need to request their graduate transcript from Lincoln, even if the program was offered wholly in Omaha. Transcripts can be pre-ordered up to be delivered after graduation (verifying graduation) up to three months before graduation.
- Your request and transcript must be received within 12 months of graduation from the EAC/ABET-accredited engineering program.
