- Resume
- GRE score (check with your department)

Funding

Two of the most common ways for graduate students through a Graduate Research Assistantship (GRA) or a Graduate Teaching Assistantship (GTA). GRAs work under the direction of a faculty advisor and perform tasks related to progressing the research mission. GTAs assist in the education of undergraduate students by conducting lab sessions and assisting professors. Both position include the benefits of:

- Tuition remission of up to 12 credit hours per semester
- A minimum \$2,600 monthly stipend
- Individual student health insurance coverage at a reduced cost
